Finally, we would like to wish you all a wonderful Easter break and we look forward to welcoming you all back into school on Monday 16th April.

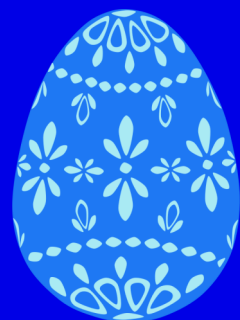

Class Two: While our Year 6 pupils have been on their Residential, the Year 3's and 4's have been working hard in English, creating Spooky Movie Trailers using 'Show, not tell' techniques to build tension and suspense. With their IT skills the children have produced two (quite terrifying!) pieces of film work.

In Maths the children have been doing Number: Addition and Subtraction, progressing from adding 3 digit and 1 digit numbers (with exchange), subtracting 1 digit numbers from 3 digit numbers (with exchange), through to adding 3 digit numbers to tens (with exchanging).
